

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Arrangements must be finalized prior to applying for your marriage license including:

- Your wedding date
 - The city village or township where your marriage is taking place
 - Officiant– Must provide name, address & phone number of officiant
- Make an appointment to apply for your marriage license (see contact information)
- Certified Birth Certificate (long form) with raised or ink seal issued from County or State. *(No photocopy and not a Hospital Certificate or State Notification of Birth Registration.)*
See letter "B" under Requirements for a birth certificate that is in a Foreign Language
- Photo IDs (unexpired)
- Proof of Residency for both applicants
- Social Security Numbers
- If previously married - Proof of Marriage Dissolution: Divorce Certificate, Final judgement of divorce signed by a judge, State Annulment, Death Certificate
- Correct spelling of parents' legal names: First, Middle and Last *(maiden name for mother)*
- Parental Consent Form - if under age of 18

Note: Any documents that are in a foreign language, including divorce papers or death certificates, MUST be translated in English and certified by a translator.

FEES

- \$75 Application Fee **(Check or Cash only)**
- \$25 waiver fee (in addition to Application fee) if applying less than 6 days prior to wedding (provided only under special circumstances)

Note: \$20.00 - License Reprint fee

Certified Documents from the Register of Deeds:

Birth, Death and Divorce Certificates are available statewide. *Note: Death Certificates previous to 2013 and Divorce Certificates previous to 2016 are only available from the county where the event occurred*

Divorce Judgments from the Clerk of Courts:

Copies of final Divorce Judgments - available from the county where the divorce occurred.

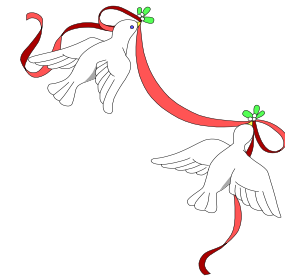

WHERE TO APPLY:

If getting married in Wisconsin, you must obtain your marriage license from a County Clerk's office in Wisconsin

Marriage License applications are taken

BY APPOINTMENT:

Monday - Thursday 7:00 am -11:30am and
1:00 pm - 4:00 pm on the half hour
Fridays - 7:00 am - 10:30 am on the half hour.
(excludes Holidays)

The marriage license application process takes approximately 15-30 minutes to complete.

Out of state weddings: You do not get a license in Wisconsin. Check with the state or country of which you plan to get married.

WHEN TO APPLY:

Application must be made at least **4 FULL DAYS** before ceremony since a 3-day waiting period is **required** before license can be issued.

License is first issued to the applicants on the 4th day, provided it is a business day (Closed weekends and Holidays)
Application day does not count as a day

Special Dispensation: A 3-day waiting period is required by law, but under Special Dispensation may be waived for an additional fee.

License is valid for 60 days from issuance date (Cannot apply more than 63 days out from wedding date)

FEES:

- \$75.00 - Marriage License fee
- \$25.00 - Waiver fee to waive the waiting period due to *Special Dispensation.
- \$20.00 - Marriage License Reprint fee

AGE:

Any person who has attained the age of 18 years may marry. If a person is between the ages of 16 and 18 years, the license will be issued only with written consent of parents, guardian or custodian. Parents must be present in County Clerk's Office to fill out consent forms.

PERSONS WHO MAY NOT MARRY:

- Blood relatives who are nearer of kin than second cousin, except when the female is 55 years of age or older, or proof of sterility is provided.
- Persons who are incompetent.
- A person under the age of 16.
- Persons who have not been divorced for more than six months, whether the divorce was granted in Wisconsin or elsewhere.

CEREMONY:

OFFICIANTS: Accredited ordained minister, priest, judge, or other person qualified to be an "Officiant" can perform the ceremony (per WI SS 765.16). **Neither our office nor the State Vital Records Office is able to confirm the legality of a religious officiant.** If you have a question about the legality of the officiant you have chosen, you may want to seek private legal counsel.

WITNESSES: Two witnesses, age 18 or older, are required, in addition to the person officiating. They do not have to be in the wedding party. If one or both applicants are active Military, only one witness signature is required.

VALIDITY:

Wisconsin Residents - Out-of-State: Marriage of Wisconsin residents in another state is null and void if such marriage would be prohibited in Wisconsin

Non-Wisconsin Residents: Marriage in Wisconsin of non-residents is null and void if such marriage would be prohibited in the state of their residence.

REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Both applicants must apply, together, in person.
- B. Applicants must present a **CERTIFIED** document of their **birth certificate**, with a **raised or ink seal** affixed by the Register of Deeds. (NO photocopy) [S.S. 765.09(3)] *If the Birth Certificate is in a foreign language, it must be translated in English and certified by a translator and provide that along with the Certified Birth Certificate*
No Exceptions.
*(Hospital Birth Certificates and State Notification of Birth Registration are **NOT** acceptable; they are not legal documents).*
- C. If previously married, present **signed** copies of judgment of divorce by judge, court annulment papers, or death certificate, *in English*, from last marriage. Divorce must be final a minimum of 6 months.
- D. Name, address & phone number of officiant, date and location (county & municipality) of ceremony. *(If using a judge, the judge must be from Wisconsin)*
- E. Social Security Number.
(You **MUST** provide a Social Security number if you have been assigned one. We cannot issue Marriage License without number)
- F. Documentary proof of identification. Each party must present photo identification *(driver's license, passport, school ID, etc.)*
- G. Documentary proof of Residence.
Each party must present documentation showing a current address for proof of residency *(drivers license, bank statement, utility bill, rent receipt, etc. Must be over **30 days old**).*

Without the required information, a marriage license WILL NOT be issued.
